What we are covering in each subject

Literacy- We are learning about the story called Handa's Surprise and adapting it to create our own version. Science- We will be focussing on plants and learning about what they need to survive. Music- This term will listen to, learn and perform call and response songs from around the world. Art- We will be exploring the use of tone when shading pictures to create work in the style of a mural inspired by Nancy McCroskey.
