During this term, classes have been learning about Romans and electricity, toys through the ages and Tudors. I can see handwriting and spellings improving, and the classes are enthusiastic about their topics.

Our classes are at the beginning stages of preparation for the assessments that will happen later in the year. Year 6 are obviously beginning to focus on their SATS tests and Miss Betts will be holding a SATS workshop for parents, to explain was is involved in these tests. Year 4 are focusing on their times tables, ready for their multiplication tables check (MTC), taking place at the start of June. Cedar Class are focused on their phonics and early reading work, preparing for their phonics screening test, which takes place towards the end of the year. CLASSES



NURSERY AND BEECH

Little Squirrels Nursey and Reception have enjoyed learning all about Space during this last half term. They have learnt the names of some of the planets, imagined what it would be like to live in Space and thought about what they may find if they visited another planet. The children in Little Squirrels used their imagination to draw and create their own aliens, whilst the children in reception used their literacy skills to write about what they thought space would be like. We all enjoyed a trip to Alveley Old Chapel Tea Rooms where we were welcomed with a tea party to enjoy whilst listening to the story 'Tea Time in Space'.



ELM

In Elm this half term we have travelled back in time to the Romans! We have enjoyed learning all about Roman battle strategies and armour! We even had a Roman visit us and Mr Marsh transformed into a Roman soldier for the afternoon! We got to ask lots of questions and found out all about their life.

We have also been learning all about electricity and produced some amazing non-chronological reports to show case our learning!



CEDAR

This half term Cedar Class' topic has been Amazing Animals. The children have engaged well with this topic, developing a fondness for Plop the barn owl. Plop is the main character from the focus book we have been learning about: The Owl Who Was Afraid of The Dark by Jill Tomlinson. In Literacy children have completed guided reading activities based on the story, writing about the characters and they have even written an additional chapter. Closely linked to our topic, pupils have been learning about animals, including humans in science. In maths children have been practising their times tables, learning about place value, shape and money.



DAK

Oak Class have had a very energetic and exciting half term! In PE, we have been focusing on problem solving and teamwork. We used pieces of equipment to travel around the room and to complete group tasks. Year 5 represented the school in the Tennis Festival at Oldbury Wells, taking part in doubles games and several children being recognised for demonstrating school games values. They all represented the school well when completing the activities.

Year 6 had a visit from Alveley First Responders and completed some first aid including performing CPR and learning about how a defibrillator works. They answered any questions we had and showed us some ways they assist those in need. The team showcased their specialised equipment and explained its use. Some of us even had the opportunity to try it out!

OUR LEARNING

Each day, children have adult led activities, including a daily phonics lesson delivered to all children. Following their adult led learning, children work with a teacher to complete scaffolded activities. While some children are completing work with their teacher, others engage in child initiated learning, supported by other adults. To maximise learning opportunities, children have daily access to both an indoor and outdoor classroom, where independence and choice are encouraged. All areas of the EYFS framework, including reading, writing and mathematics are planned coherently across all ages and activities and opportunities are appropriately adapted to meet each child's needs, deepening and extending their understanding. Within the carefully planned environment, stimulus and enhanced provision is used to excite, capture and motivate the children and provide learning opportunities.





JOIN OUR NURSERY!

A positive ethos is at the heart of our EYFS unit. It is extremely important that the children feel happy and comfortable within the setting; where they are constantly supported and encouraged. The children's achievements are recognised and celebrated. This ethos allows for and encourages problem solving, resilience, curiosity and high levels of engagement. Friends of Alveley School have hosted their first event of the year, a film night at school, the event was well supported and enjoyed by


We have some more events planned during the next half term which we hope the children will look forward to:

Here are some examples of questions you could ask while reading. These will help with reading comprehension knowledge and deepen understanding of what has been read.

Vocabulary Draw upon knowledge of vocabulary in order to understand the text.	Infer Make inferences from the text.	Predict Predict what you think will happen based on the information that you have been given.	Explain Explain your preferences, thoughts and opinions about the text.	Retrieve Identify and explain the key features of fiction and non-fiction texts such as: characters, events, titles and information.	Sequence Sequence the key events in the story.
