Maths Challenge

Each week children will complete a maths challenge. Children will have 10 minutes to complete 50 maths calculations. Children require a minimum score of 47 out of 50 to pass. Once children have achieved 47 or above, they will move onto the next maths challenge. Children are to practise at home.

What we are covering in each subject

Literacy-Our reading and writing will be focus on several Traditional Tales, including Little Red Riding Hood. Children will have the opportunity to write their own traditional tale. <u>Maths-</u> We will be learning about place value (within 1000 and shape. <u>History-</u> We will be learning how school was different in the past. <u>Science-</u> We will be looking at scientific enquiry, as well as learning about seasonal changes.

Music- We will be learning about timbre and rhythmic patterns. DT- We will be exploring cooking and nutrition, and will be making a fruit smoothie. PSHE- We will be looking at citizenship. RE- We will be exploring the topic 'Why does Easter matter to Christians?' <u>Computing -</u> We are learning about how to keep safe online. <u>PE -</u> We will be learning yoga and target games.

Forest school will be on a **Friday afternoon**. Please ensure your child comes to school with their kit to change into. Please bring waterproofs and wellingtons to change into each Friday.

Spellings
